

Dear Friends,

As we prepare to elect a new Vestry on Sunday, May 5th at 9:00am in Paca Hall, I want to update you on other exciting developments.

The first is that we are interviewing candidates for the Assistant to the Rector position. Mike Whatley and his committee comprised of Jay Liwanag, Beverly Palmer and Becky Robinson have been hard at work reviewing resumes, listening to sermons and responding to applicants whose gifts for ministry were not a fit for us at this time. Our new Assistant will, with Rev. Janettarose and me, exercise the full range of priestly responsibilities with a special emphasis on grafting new persons into the life of the parish and helping all of us to move deeper into our Christian witness and vocation. We have every reason to believe that the right person will quickly emerge and join us in ministry in the near future.



Second, we are in the process of hiring someone to lead the music for Wilderness Church. Garadine, or "G" as she is happy to be called, is studying at Virginia Theological Seminary with her husband and has led music ministries in various parts of the country. She is a guitarist, vocalist, and plays the piano, but her "real" instrument is the tuba. Rev. Janettarose, whose responsibilities include Wilderness Church, is in the process of finalizing details with G and the leadership of Wilderness Church. We are grateful for past music leader, the Rev. Jared Moore, as he graduates from Virginia Seminary and prepares to be ordained to the priesthood and serve the church in Missouri.

Third, Derek Greten-Harrison will join us for May, June, and July on a full-time basis to assist Andrea in the administration of the parish. I am excited that Andrea will be able to devote more of her time to our ministry of communications—the website, email blasts, Tuesday Thoughts, The Messenger, etc.—but she does need help to attend to all the other aspects of our common life. This will also help us determine if additional leadership in the ministry of administration should be full or part-time. Derek will be going back to school in the fall pursuing a degree in social work. He is an accomplished singer and worked in the area of academic admissions for many years. Please welcome him to our parish.

Finally, that leads to the question of how will all of us step up best and play our part in the leadership and ministry of St. Mary's. If you were not able to make a financial commitment in the form of a pledge in the fall stewardship campaign, or if you have joined since then, it is not too late. Everyone is responsible for the stewardship of our time, talent and treasure if we are to be a healthy witness to God's love for the whole world.

The months of summer afford us the opportunity to take stock of our lives and God's claim upon them. We are the flawed but mighty vessels that God has chosen to share the Good News of Jesus. Each of us has a role to play in the story of salvation.

May the Peace of the Lord always be with you.

On the Go Prayer

don't know about you, but my life feels pretty hectic these days! In Youth and Family Formation, we're planning special ways to honor all students transitioning to new schools or new chapters in life and preparing to mark the end of the program year with celebrations, worship services and gifts of appreciation for our amazing leaders. Let us not forget all of the many arts, sports, family and fun activities that seem to fill every evening or weekend! I sometimes catch myself at the end of a long day wondering where God was, or if I slowed down long enough to even say a gratitude prayer or think of a loved one or student who needs to remember that they are loved. It can be difficult to cultivate a deep and consistent prayer life when life keeps going a mile a minute, but I've found a few strategies that help me that I'd like to share.



Spend one minute on each of the following five applications on your phone.

Text Messages: pray for the last five people you received a text from (whether you know them or not!)

News App: Scroll through the headlines and pray for what jumps out at you as a prayer need today.

Social Media: Pray for individuals who pop up in your feed.

Notepad: Type out whatever comes to mind: a praise, gratitude, confession or request to God.

Photos: Scroll through your last twenty photos and lift up any prayers that come to mind.

(Smartphone Prayers from "Faithful Families, Creating Sacred Moments at Home," by Traci Smith.) Practice kindness, gratitude, hospitality, forgiveness, empathy, generosity and other characteristics... that describe Jesus and reflect on how those practices make you or your family feel.

Build in a set time in your day to meditate or settle your mind and listen for God. Begin or end with scripture or prayer, such as this prayer attributed to St. Francis.

Prayer of St. Francis of Assisi. Lord, make me an instrument of thy peace. where there is hatred, let me sow love, where there is injury, pardon; where there is doubt, faith; where there is despair, hope; where there is darkness, light; And where there is sadness, joy. O Divine Master, grant that I may not so much seek to be consoled as to console, to be understood as to understand, to be loved, as to love. For it is in giving that we receive, It is in pardoning that we are pardoned, and it is in dying that we are born to eternal life.

Lilly Lewin at <u>https://www.freerangeworship.com/</u> <u>digital-sanctuary/</u> shares several digital prayer stations you can try at home. Her workshop at a conference I attended gave me great ideas for implementing prayer station learning with our students like above.

An Update from the St. Mary's Outreach Committee

t. Mary's Outreach Committee directs parish-wide work that God calls us to do enabling us to love and serve our neighbors. Our Parish priorities guide our work: the care of creation, caring for one another, and racial reconciliation. The actions we take include providing food for our neighbors by making meals for the unhoused via <u>PathForward</u>, and by distributing food with the <u>Arlington Food Assistance Center (AFAC</u>). We help those in affordable housing by supporting <u>Arlington Partnership for Affordable Housing (APAH)</u> with

school supplies and with our Thanksgiving food drive. We have a grant budget that enables us to support a wide variety of organizations that align with our Parish priorities including orphanages in several African countries, urban agriculture, the tree canopy, job training for women re-entering the workforce, recent immigrant families, and those formerly incarcerated.

The Parish's Outreach Committee has 15 members including clergy and staff.

We accomplish this with parish volunteers who make sandwiches, distribute food, and run donation drives for food, housewares, and clothing. If you would like to be involved in this work, the parish website has names of parishioners who lead these activities and they are always in need of volunteers. See the link below to the Outreach section of the website.

The Parish's Outreach Committee has 15 members including clergy and staff. They work together to set the goals of St. Mary's outreach efforts, provide oversight of the volunteer activities, manage special projects and recommend grants to organizations deserving of our support.
